
## **Dow dollars dirty Olympic games**

Dow Chemical is a major sponsor of the London Olympics, despite <u>protests</u> around the world and <u>opposition efforts</u> by Indian civil society and government.

As the owner of the company that perpetrated one of the <u>worst industrial disasters</u> in history, Dow Chemical has done absolutely nothing to accept responsibility for, or compensate the victims of, the <u>ongoing Bhopal Gas Tragedy of 1984</u>.

To add insult to injury, Dow's toxic legacy of human rights abuse is being completely ignored by the International Olympics Committee, who are essentially awarding Dow misplaced international goodwill and brand recognition by allowing the corporation to sponsor this prestigious event on the global stage.

The Olympic Committee is not alone, however, in granting Dow a free pass. Dow and the Big 6 have an impressive track record of getting away with blatant human rights violations, while our governments stand by and fail to act. This is why it's so important for us — individuals and communities — to act, and hold corporations accountable across borders of geography and time.
